The Rabbi Speaks

It is no surprise to me to have read the following in the front page of the Jewish Advocate of November 16, '72:

Dr. Gerson D. Cohen, Chancellor of the Jewish Theological Seminary, (that institution which ordains conservative rabbis) addressing the Biennial Convention of the Conservative Women's League, said "that Conservative Judaism was losing Jewish youth because of the lack of fervency in its ritual. That Conservative Judaism could never be transplanted in Israel." Dr. Cohen continued, "Many young Jews are defecting from Conservative Judaism. Young people are looking to the Orthodox because they seek fervency and uninhibited expression in synagogue worship. They want to become uninhibited Jews."

I believe the above statement speaks for itself. The secularization, commercialization, and superficiality introduced by some of our religious movements have left much to be desired. Young Jews looking for authenticity have turned to Orthodoxy.

In this vein I only wish that more of you could have witnessed the N.C.S.Y. weekend which was held at our synagogue—250 youth surrounded and enveloped by their religion enjoying themselves. The atmosphere was electrifying. The Shabbos was spent in an Orthodox framework.

This was a Shabbos spent in a warm congenial observance. All meals resounded with song and dance. Adults and teens alike actually cried when departure time arrived. One of our older members was so taken that he
