The Man Who Has Made Rockland An Important Movie Center

Joseph Dondis, a Russian immigrant, who arrived in America in 1891 has hurdled many obstacles, in order to hold the many important positions he now possesses. Dondis is manager of the Strand Theatre in Rockland, Me. and is president of the Dondis Amusement Co., who own the property of the Strand. He is also vice president of the Rockland Amusement Co.

In 1902 he went to Boston to make his livelihood after working for his relatives, while going to school. He interested himself in odd jobs about the different hotels until 1904 when he came to Rockland, Me. to peddle stationery. Later he opened a stationery store for himself. He remained in this business for six years. From this business he entered the wholesale bottling works, then the fish business and novelty selling. With money garnered by his varied enterprises, Dondis purchased the plot where the present Strand is now located. He built and operated the theatre until April 1928 when Publix and Mr. Dondis combined to form the Rockland Amusement Co. Mr. Dondis was retained as local manager.

Joseph Dondis long ago gained the full confidence of the Rockland amusement-loving public. It admired his brave struggle as an independent manager, and is not slow to recognize that his knowledge of the game and his influence in motion picture circles is largely responsible for the present excellent service at Strand Theatre. He treats the public courteously and understandingly.

Rockland Businesswoman Ida Dondis Dies

Ida Povich Dondis, a prominent Rockland businesswoman and civic leader for more than 60 years, died Saturday at a Rockport hospital after a long illness. She was 90 years old.

She was born on Oct. 2, 1892 in Freehold, N.J., and moved with her family to Ellsworth at an early age. Her parents, Michael and Esther Povich, were Lithuanian Jewish immigrants who started a general store in Ellsworth that is still being run by the family.

She was graduated from Ellsworth High School and Castine Normal School and taught school in Ellsworth for several years. She married Joseph Dondis, a businessman from Fall River, Mass., and they settled in Rockland in 1914. A short time later, they built the Strand, a motion picture theater on Main Street.

After her husband died in 1940, she took over management of the Strand, running it for 41 years until her retirement in 1981. However, at the age of 88, just before she stepped down from the theater's active management, she oversaw its expansion and modernization into a double cinema.

Besides her business affairs, she served as president of the Hadassah chapter in Rockland for 50 years, a member of the Congregation Adas Yeshuron, the Adas Yeshuron Sisterhood, and was also an officer in a wide variety of civic organizations, including the Shakespeare, Methuenic and Garden Clubs.

She also placed a plaque on the summit of Mount Battie in Camden honoring poetess Edna St. Vincent Millay.

A favorite local anecdote illustrating her indomitable spirit was born several years ago, when, in her late 80's, Mrs. Dondis found herself trapped in her garage because of a defective automatic door. Rather than wait passively for help, she got back into her car, put it in reverse and blasted through the door into the sunshine.

Mrs. Dondis was the centerpiece of an active family, leaving two sons, Meredith of Rockland and Harold of Belmont, Mass., two sisters, Ane Povich of Rockland and

Goldie Lampert of Ellsworth; two granddaughters, Jo Himmelstein and Lynn Dondis, both of Portland; and one great granddaughter, Drew Himmelstein of Portland.

The funeral was held Sunday at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Bangor, with Rabbi Joseph Schonberger officiating. Interment was in Beth Israel Cemetery, Bangor. Memorial week will be observed at her residence, 69 Beech Street, Rockland.

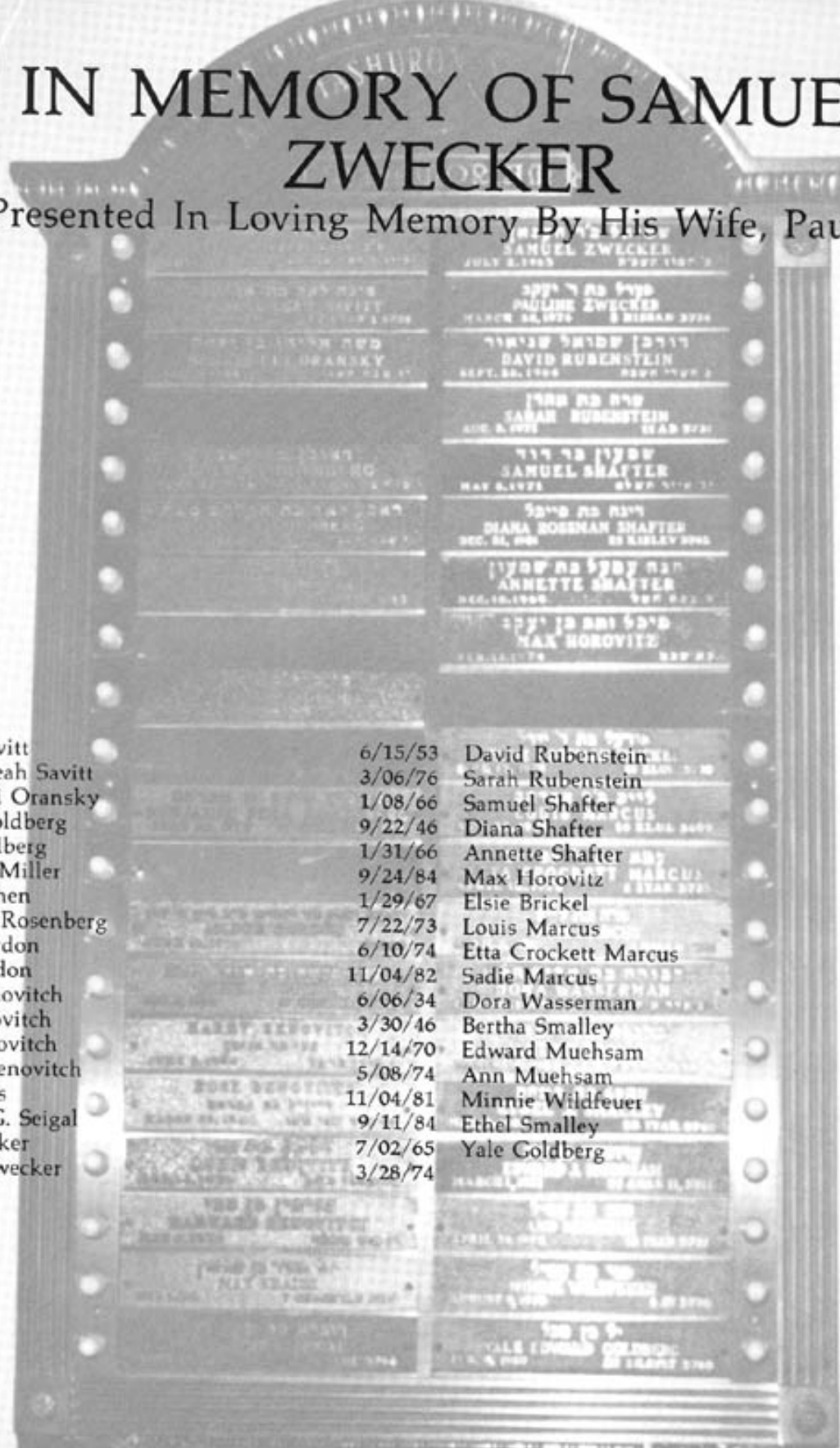

SUCH MEMORIES OF NATHAN BERLIAWSKY



Our Nate was born in Russia on November 2, 1898. He arrived in Rockland in 1904 with his father, Isaac, and his mother, Minazeesel.

Except for Navy service in World War I, Nate remained in Rockland for most of his life. At a Sheriff's Auction in 1937, he purchased the Thorndike Hotel on the corner of Main Street and Tillson Avenue. From its run-down state, he developed the hotel into the community's leading year-round hotel through the 50s and 60s.

Many considered Nate the unofficial host of the City of Rockland. In 1962 the Jaycees named him the recipient of their 5th Annual Distinguished Service Award; his citation noted that he had given generously of himself and his talents to Rockland, Knox County and the State of Maine.

Nate served as a trustee on Rockland's first Urban Renewal Authority Board; organizer and former president of Midcoast Route 1 Association; director of the Maine Publicity Bureau; past president of the Rockland Chamber of Commerce; and a founder of Maine Coast Artists and the Bay Chambers Concerts Association.

A patron of the arts and supporter of the area's cultural development, Nate donated art objects from his extensive collection over the years and after he sold the Thorndike Hotel benefitting the Farnsworth Museum, Colby College, and Penobscot Bay Medical Center. A Nevelson sculpture he gave to the Brooklyn Museum is now on exhibition at the Whitney Museum of American Art. In November 1979, he donated to the Farnsworth his entire collection of photographic and written material about his sister, Louise Nevelson, to form the Nevelson Archives.
