Rabbi Harold Kushner speaks at rededication of Beth Israel

Congregation Beth Israel on Sunday began a yearlong celebration to mark its 100 years of existence in Bangor.


Noted author Rabbi Harold S. Kushner of Natick, Mass., was the featured speaker at the rededication. The author of "When Bad Things Happen to Good People," and "When All You've Ever Wanted Isn't Enough," Kushner said that loneliness was the plague of the 20th century, and that the essence of prayer was doing it together.

Rabbi Joseph P. Schonberger and Norman Minsky, president of the congregation, welcomed those attending.

Beth Israel began on May Street in 1888, kindled by a group of 17 European immigrants. The congregation has been in the synagogue at 144 York St. for 75 years.
