Tuesday morning Joseph Fink l, a Mexican, and Morris Shabshio, a Jew, employed at the Bath Iron Works, had a dispute. Finkel struck Shabshio in the nasal organ which so injured that member that its owner thought it good enough for a warrant and had Recorder W. S. Glidden make out the same, charging Finkel with assault. 1

Immediately Shabshio left the yard Finkel jumped the fence and disappeared. When Officer Jack armed with the warrant searched for his man he was not to be found.

Tuesday afternoon Marshal Revnolds received a telephone message from the Brunswick police station inquiring if he knew of a man by the name of Finkel who worked in the Bath Iron Works. Marshal Reynolds telephoned back that he did and to hold the man as there was a warrant for his arrest on a case of assault and battery.

Finkel was arrested while walking into Brunswick by the officers who held him as a suspect in regard to the Saturday night assault against Mrs. Sarah Knowles at Harding Station.

He told the Brunswick officers that he worked at the Bath Iron Works but Tuesday morning hit a man and left.

Finkel is a Mexican and was with the Pawnee Bill Wild West show when it appeared here the first of the summer. He secured a position in the Iron Works and took French leave of the show. He is a very stocky man while Shabshio is a short, thick set fellow much o'der than his assailant.
