

NATHAN POVICH

Bath Business Man Dies in Washington Where He Was Passing Winter.

Nathan Povich, 65, died of heart trouble Sunday morning in Washington, D. C., where he and Mrs. Povich had gone Jan. 4, to pass the Winter.

Mr. Povich was born in Baltermantz, Lithuania. He came to the United States about 45 years ago. In Boston, he married Miss Rcsa Povich. They resided in Bar Harbor for 30 years before coming to this city, where they had passed 14 years. Mr. Povich was well known as the proprietor of the Music Hall block, corner Washington and Center street. The Povich home is at 327 Front street.

Mr. Povich was a member of the congregation of the Beth Israel synagogue, of the B'nai B'rith, of the Odd Fellows and the Knights of Pythias.

Besides his wife he is survived by nine children: Mrs. Morris S. Povich, Miss Dorice, both of this city; Miss Goldie, Boston; Miss Celia, Portland; Shirley L. and Abraham, both of Washington, D. C.; Morris E. Julius J. and Bernard all of this city. He is also survived by two grandchildren, Albert and Donald Povich, and by three sisters, Mrs. Jennie Solovich and Mrs. Ida Miller, both of this city and Mrs. Annie Iserson of Woodhaven, L. I., N. Y., and Mrs. Dora Preble of Woodbury, N. J. He is also survived by several nieces and nephews.

The body was taken to Portland, where the funeral took place Monday morning.
