BENJAMIN S. GEDIMAN

Well Known Bath Citizen and Prominent in Jewish Activities Dies Aged 76 Years

The funeral of Benjamin Sam-uel Gediman, 41 Pratt street, who would have observed his 76th birthday Thursday night during the lighting of the Fifth Candle in the annual Jewish cel-ebration of Chanukah, was held Tuesday morning at nine at his home. Rev. Abraham May of this city conducted the service, and burial was in Mt. Sinai cem-etery, Portland. Mr. Gediman, who had been in ill health for some time but whose condition had not been considered serious until Sunday when he was removed to Bath Memorial hospital, died there Monday afternoon at 5.30.

Memorial hospital, died there Monday afternoon at 5.30. Mr. Gediman was born in Kovno, Russia, a son of Ephraim and Esther Gediman, and was one of 10 children. He came to the United States as a young man of 17. For a time he made his home in Boston and 40 years ago came to Bath, where he had since resided. He was for a time engaged in the picture framing I engaged in the picture framing business and later, for many years, was a milk dealer, a business from which he retired a few

years ago. Of a kindly disposition, Mr. Gediman was well known and well hked and few persons num-bered more friends throughout the State than did he. He was prominent in the activities of the Tewish community in the city. prominent in the activities of the Jewish community in the city, having been a charter member of the Beth Israel synagogue, a trustee of it for a number of years and a vice president of the Men's congregation. He was for many years ward clerk of Ward 5, a position he held at the time of his death. He was one of the aldest mem

of his death. He was one of the oldest mem-bers, in point of membership, of King Solomon lodge of Odd Fel-lows, of Boston, having hear the elect lows, of Boston, having been among the first to join following the closing of the charter of that organization.
