With Europe going through the grimmest years in recent history, a mil-lion and a half surviving Jews still totter on the brink of death through starvistion, disease and cold. All their possession have been looted, confiscated or de-stroyed by the Nazis.

Over 90 per cent of these survivors live in countries where UNREA does not operate and, therefore, they do not receive aid from the international agency.

Items solicited include, food. comfort items and medicine, household supplies and infants' and children's items of clothing, These articles may be either new or used providing they are in good condition. In addition food items also are requested.
