Then came the wooden block on the corner of the alley way and in the brick building now occupied by O. M. Redlon the late Walter G. Webber had a drug store back in the early seventies and later Filene of Boston operated the Boston Bargain Clothing Co., in that store under the initial B. B. C. C. The late George E. and his brother Frank N. Thompson managed this store for Filene and it led to their opening of a clothing store of their own and made famous the name of Thompson Bros., Clothiers, known throughout this section of Maine. This latter store is now the Newberry store in Sagadahock block. The late William H. Swett had a grocery store at the corner of Ferry and Front streets.
