The bride wore an embossed white organdy gown fashioned with sheer yoke ruffle giving an off-the-shoulder effect, long pointed sleeves and a train tapering to the floor in back from a scalloped peplum at the waist. Her shoulder-length circular veil was attached to a white organdy bonnet that was faced with lace and trimmed with sequins.
