## Morris E. Povich, of Bath, Maine, Dies

Morras E, Povich, 38, known teall his friends as "Matie" Povichdied late Sunday night, September 13, in Bath Memorial Hospital of appries received in an automobile accident at Boothhay Huthor on Thansday night, September 10. A Democratic candidate for the Jegislature, his tragic death occurred on the eve of the state election.

Well known and popular throughout the state, Morris E. Povich was born in Bar Hatbor on December 10, 1898, a son of Mrs. Rosa Povich and the late Nathan Povich. 144 fore coming to Bath, he had made his home in Bar Harbor and Bus ton. He was graduated from Bar Harbor High School and attended Northeastern University in Boston and also studied law at Boston University. For approximately six years he was employed in the advertising department of the Boston American.

Since 1929, he had conducted the Standard Furniture Company in Rath. He was president of the Bath Lodge of Bina Ruth, a memher of Beth Lonel Congregation, and helonged to the Masons, Elks and the Knights of Pythias.
