## Obituaries



Samuel Fish

**BELMONT, MASS.** — Samuel Fish, 86, a long-time resident of Presque Isle, died at his home in Belmont, Mass., Sept. 1.

His funeral was held Sept. 3 in Lexington, Mass., with burial in Montifiore Cemetery in Woburn, Mass.

Mr. Fish was born in Boston May 8, 1892 and moved to Bangor as a young boy. After graduation from high school there in 1911 he moved to Presque Isle. At that time, he became a bookkeeper with a local potato brokerage firm. He later associated with Ben Marks of the Ben Marks Co. in Presque Isle.

After several years, he became a partner with Mr. Marks and they owned and operated several farms in the area, growing seed potatoes, until Mr. Mark's death in 1954. At that time, Mr. Fish became full owner of the company and continued to operate the business until his retirement in 1964. In 1972, he and his wife moved to Belmont, Mass.

During the 61 years he lived in Presque Isle, Mr. Fish took an active part in community activities. He was a 50-year member of the Masons Trinity Lodge 130 and the Eastern Star, Lunar Chapter.

He is survived by his wife, Ida

(Levine) Fish of Belmont; two daughters, Anna Shriber of Lexington, Mass., and Judith Cohen of Painted Post, N.Y.; and six grandchildren.
