BELMONT, MASS. - Samuel Fish, 86, a long-time resident of Presque Isle, died at his home in Belmont, Mass., Sept. 1.

His funeral was held Sept. 3 in Lexington, Mass., with burial in Montifiore Cemetery in Woburn, Mass.

Mr. Fish was born in Boston May 8, 1892 and moved to Bangor as a young boy. After graduation from high school there in 1911 he moved to Presque Isle. At that time, he became a bookkeeper with a local potato brokerage firm. He later associated with Ben Marks of the Ben Marks Co. in Presque Isle.
