The Pickar family appears in the 1910, 1920 and 1930 census records. According to these reports George was born in Rhode Island, the son of Barnard (or Barnett) and Bessie Pickar. Barnard and Bessie were born in about 1883 and 1885, respectively. They were both born in Russia (listed as Odessa in one report) and immigrated to America, Barnard in 1902 or 1903; and Bessie in 1899 or 1902. They married in 1906 or 1907. Barnard first appears as a clothing peddler in 1910, continues to have this occupation in 1920 at which time he owns a home, and by 1930 is a collector for an "installment company" and owns what seems to be an expensive home (worth \$15,000). George was born in about 1908 and had younger siblings Sadie, Bert (shown as Robert and Berthram), Ruth and Irving. According to Joanne Pickar, Sadie was regarded as being a "wild" teenager and was sent away. She appears as a 20-year-old at the "Exeter School" in the 1930 census. It housed about 1000 people, aged 6 to 50. Some appear to have attended vocational classes while there.

The 1930 census showed George at age 22, and having "attended school within the last year." He was not shown with an occupation, and given his age, he was probably attending college.
