(Prerequisite—ability to read Hebrew) Course will include elementary grammatical forms and fundamental beginnings of conversation Hebrew.

Advanced Hebrew 8:15–9:00 P.M. Rabbi Ephraim Bennett

(Prerequisite—ability to understand simple Hebrew and elementary Hebrew grammar.) Course will include conversational Hebrew

Jewish Ethics 9:15-10:00 P.M.

The course will include basic attitudes in ethical approaches to labor, business, education, the Gentile world, society and humanity at large. The course will also include practical application of Jewish ritualistic life to the everyday life of the Jew.
