## Film Depicting Anti-Semitism To Be Shown On WCSH-TV

As part of the recognition of the plight of Soviet Jewry, Portland will bring attention to the 3,000,000 Jews in Russia by showing the film, "Price of Silence," narrated by Edward G. Robinson. This will be shown on Community in Focus program on WCSH-TV on Sunday, December 18, at 9:30 A.M. This film depicting Anti-Semitism in Russia is being sponsored by the Jewish Federation Community Relations Committee, Dr. Benjamin Zolov, Chairman. Added comments will be made by Rabbi Morris Bekritsky and Rabbi Harry Z. Sky.

These Jews in the U.S.S.R. are being denied cultural rights and freedom — freedom to which they are entitled under both the 1917 Soviet Declaration of Rights and the 1945 United Nations Charter.

Many committees are being formed throughout the country to bring to the attention of the people this deplorable violation of human rights. The words of a Soviet Jew best point out the urgency and need of the situation. The young man in a conversation with Sholom Ben-Israel in an article in Hadassah magazine says of their plight, "Demand more, speak up louder — it's our only hope, believe me."

Programs have been held, and more will take place, over the entire nation. Here in the State of Maine, Governor Reed issued a Proclamation in which he urged all citizens to join in recognizing the unique plight of Soviet Jews.

which catapulted Jessel into initial renown, was the first constructive portrayal of a Jewish theme and protagonist in the history of the American theatre.



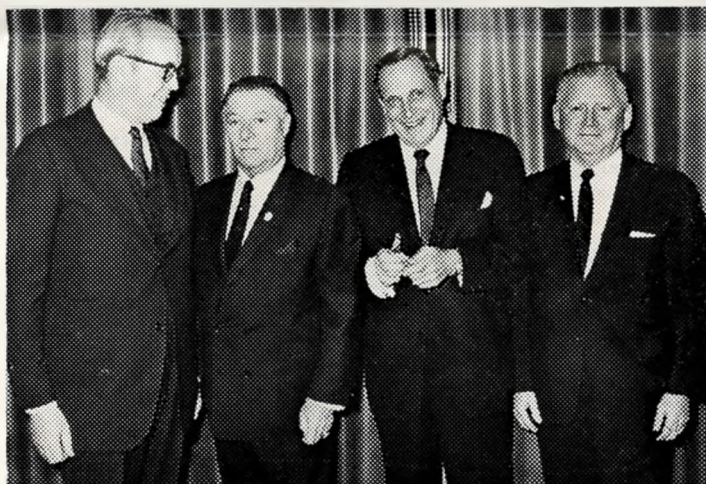

## Maine Banks Support Israel — Invest In Israel Bonds

One of the most gratifying developments for Israel's economic program during the past few years has been the increasing investment by banks in State of Israel Bonds.

Commencing in 1963 with Israel's prompt payment of both principal and interest on the Independence Issue Savings Bonds sold in 1951, several thousand commercial and fiduciary institutions throughout the United States have considered Israel Bonds a valid inclusion in their investment portfolio.

In addition, according to announcements made at Bond meetings, bank officials have voiced their admiration and sympathy for Israel's heroic record of economic progress despite the absorption of over one million immigrants and refugees.
