Since the camper returns each night to his home, an examination taken just prior to the camp season could easily be negated by being close to another camper, who is in contact with many people away from camp. Medical examinations under these conditions, therefore, do not necessarily mean complete freedom from communicable diseases.

For this reason, our camp committee has decided to accept, for our camp programs, a doctor's examination statement dated any time since the close of last year's camp season. It should be noted, however, that any special medication, attention, and/or information, which is necessary for the camper because of a physical condition should be passed along to the Camp Director.
