Before almost 200 delegates and alternates, gathered at the Federation's Annual Assembly on Thurs-lay evening, December 14th, Presient Abraham S. Levey set the keynote in a stirring message. He urged that the remarkable unity, which had already been achieved, be considered the foundation for the future growth of an even stronger and finer community.



JOE WIGON Honored In Surprise Presentation

In a surprise presentation, Barnett I. Shur, Chairman of the Federation Executive Committee, presented a Golden Book Certifiate honoring Joe Wigon, 1944 Cam-paign Chairman, for his dynamic leadership in the Campaign. This stirring ceremony followed immediately after Joe had pulled the first suprise of the evening himself. Acknowledging his deep appreci-ation for their invaluable assistance, he called upon Jacob H. Berman, George I. Lewis and Sidney Davidson, to whom he presented as his personal tribute Golden Book Certificates.
