Dr. Charles Schlosberg

Charles Schlosberg, M.D. a pediatrician for the past fifty years, died suddenly of a cerebral accident March 18

while vacationing in Florida.
Dr. Schlosberg was born in the West End of Boston 83 years ago. He attended English High, Univ. of Maine Orono and Boston University School of Medicine Class of 1934. He was associated with Children's Hospital, Beth Israel Hospital B&W Hospital and many hospitals in the

area surrounding Boston.

Dr. Schlosberg was a mohel as well as a pediatrician and was known by many in communities within a wide area of Boston. To many of his pediatric patients he was known as "Uncle Charlie" or just Dr. Charlie.

He was a member of the West End House from the age of ten. In 1964 he was given the honor of being named Outstanding West End House Alumnus at the 56th Oldtimers Camp reunion in East Parsonsfield, Maine, He was also a recipient of the Boys Club of America Award. He served as camp director, camp doctor and finally as medical director of the W.E.H. Boys Camp. He had maintained his membership at the West End House up to the present time.

Dr. Schlosberg served in the army medical corp with the rank of Captain during WWII with the 99th Evac. Hospital in the Pacific theatre.

He is survived by his wife, a son, a daughter, four grandchildren and five sisters.

Services were held at the Levine Chapel, Brookline on Thursday, March 22, burial was at Sharon Memorial Park, Sharon.
