



As a new administration begins to work for Portland, a New Year is marked by the Jewish People. Nothing new, however, are your contributions to making Portland a better place to live.


The Community Center's role as an active participant in the community is an established one.



Humility And Thanksgiving For Miracle Of Victory

We greet the New Year in a spirit of humility and thanksgiving to the Almighty G-d who has miraculously given victory to the Israeli forces over the enemies who sought their destruction. For the first time in 20 years Jews will pray on the forthcoming High Holidays at the KOTEL MAARAVI; and for the first time in 2,000 years it will be under Jewish autonomy.

The KOTEL MAARAVI was the western wall of the Temple courtyard and is all that remains of that ancient glory. Legend has it that the money for this wall was donated by the generosity of the rich and poor alike. Therefore it is indestructible and has served as the symbol of Jewish eternity.

When we pray we turn our eyes eastward towards Jerusalem and towards this wall. Here the prayers of Jews throughout the world meet. Accident Insurance Policy Available To Center Members

If you take part in any one of the activities of the Center, you can't afford to pass up the accident insurance policy available to you for the sum of \$1.50 to \$2.25 (because we have three plans). Plan No. 1 covers the year-round activities of the Center including summer day camp or summer activity programs from September 15, 1967 to September 15, 1968 at \$2.25 per Center member.

Plan No. 2 covers all Center activities from September 15, 1967 to June 15, 1968 at \$1.50 per Center member.

Plan No. 3 covers Center Day camp or summer activities programs from June 15, 1968 to September 15, 1968 at \$1.50 per Center member and day camper. When used to cover day camps, participation by all campers is required.

The expiration date of Plan 2 and the inception date of Plan 3 can be extended to coincide with Center programming.

The coverage is in effect for all injuries caused by an accident sustained while participating in the activities sponsored and supervised by the Center, and includes coverage for group travel to and from Center activities. Coverage for day camp activities is also provided. When a member requires medical treatment by a legally qualified physician or surgeon, confinement in a hospital, employment of a licensed graduate nurse and miscellaneous expenses, i.e., x-rays, drugs, dressings because of an accident covered by the policy, the insuring company will pay the actual expenses as a result of such services rendered within 52 weeks of the date of the accident. These expenses are payable up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 for each covered accident.

Any member of the Center, regardless of age, is eligible to enroll. You can't afford to be without the insurance.








