## City Manager Appreciates Response To Problems

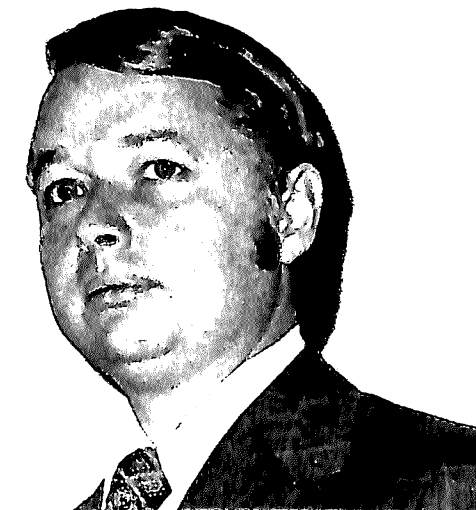

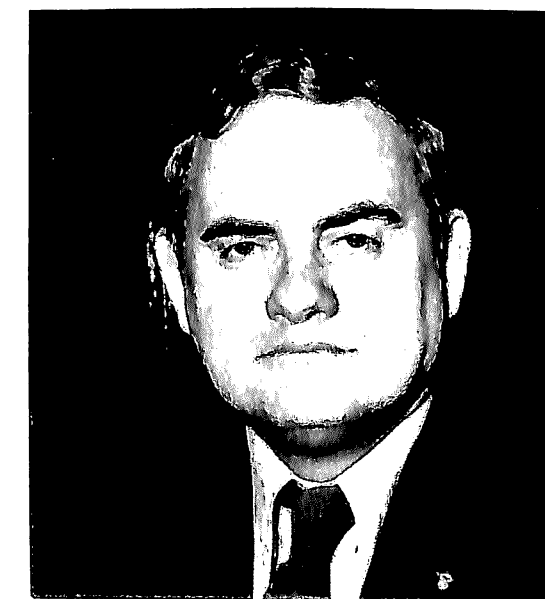

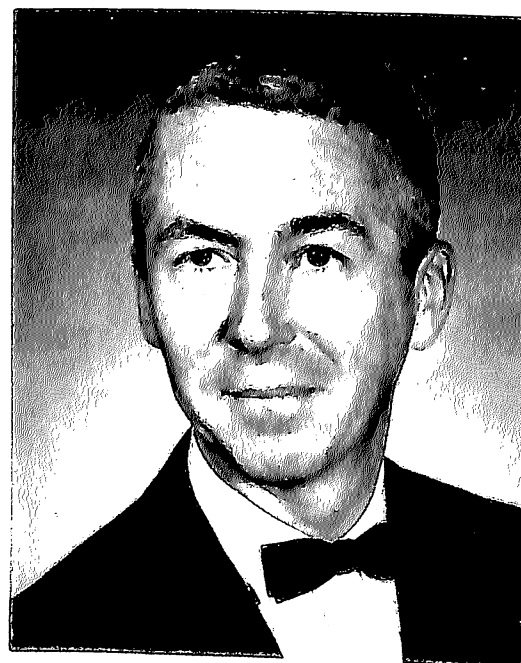

### Accident Insurance Policy Available To Center Members

#### COVERAGE

The coverage is in effect for all bodily injuries caused by an accident occurring while the Policy is in force as to the Insured Person and resulting directly and independently of all other causes in loss covered by the Policy, provided such injury is sustained by the Insured Person.

#### ELIGIBILITY and EFFECTIVE DATE

All members of the Policyholder and its member societies, regardless of age, are eligible to enroll under the plans available. Insurance will become effective as of the inception date of the plan desired or as of the postmark date on the envelope containing the list of members, whichever is later.

#### BENEFITS

The benefits payable under the policy are payable in addition to any other insurance carried by the individual.

#### ACCIDENT (Except Dental):

When an Insured Person requires medical treatment by a legally qualified physician or surgeon, confinement within a hospital, Employment of a licensed or graduate nurse, x-ray examination or use of an ambulance because of an accident covered by the policy, the insuring Company will pay, in addition to any other indemnity payable, the expense actually incurred therefor within 52 weeks after the date of the accident. These Expenses are payable up to a maximum of \$1000.00 for each covered accident.

#### DENTAL:

When an insured person suffers an injury to natural teeth which requires Dental treatment, the insuring Company will pay the expenses actually incurred by the Insured Person within 26 weeks after the date of the accident, not to exceed in the aggregate \$150.00 as the result of any one accident. If, on the certification of a Dentist, Additional Dental Treatment is required beyond the 26 week's period, and such certification is submitted to the insuring Company within 26 weeks after the date of the accident, the insuring Company will pay the expense estimated by the Dentist for such additional treatment, provided however, payment for such expense shall not be made for those expenses which are in excess of the difference between expenses incurred during such 26 week period and the aggregate limit of \$150.00 for any one accident.

#### SPECIFIC LOSS INDEMNITY:

If death or dismemberment results from a covered accident within 90 days of the accident the Company will pay \$1,000.00 in the event of death and up to \$5,000.00 for dismemberment, according to the policy schedule.

#### EXCLUSIONS:

The policy does not cover any loss caused by or resulting from (1) suicide or any attempt thereat while sane or self-destruction or any attempt thereat while insane; (2) injury sustained in consequence of riding as a passenger or otherwise in any vehicle or device for aerial navigation; nor does this Policy cover the expense of (3) replacing eyeglasses or prescriptions therefor; (4) Dental treatment except as provided for in the policy; or (5) injury sustained in consequence of participating in the play or practice of tackle football, ice hockey, soccer, snow skiing or la crosse.

#### PLANS and PREMIUMS (You may choose only one of the three plans)

PLAN I covers the year round activities of the Center including summer day camp or summer activity programs from September 15, 1973 to September 15, 1974 at \$3.50 per Center Member.

PLAN II covers all Center activities from September 15, 1973 to June 15, 1974 at \$2.25 per Center member.

PLAN III covers Center day camp or summer activities programs from June 15, 1974 to September 15, 1974 at \$1.75 per Center member and day camper. When used to cover day camps, participation by all day campers is required.

The expiration date of Plan II and the inception date of Plan III can be extended to coincide with Center programming.

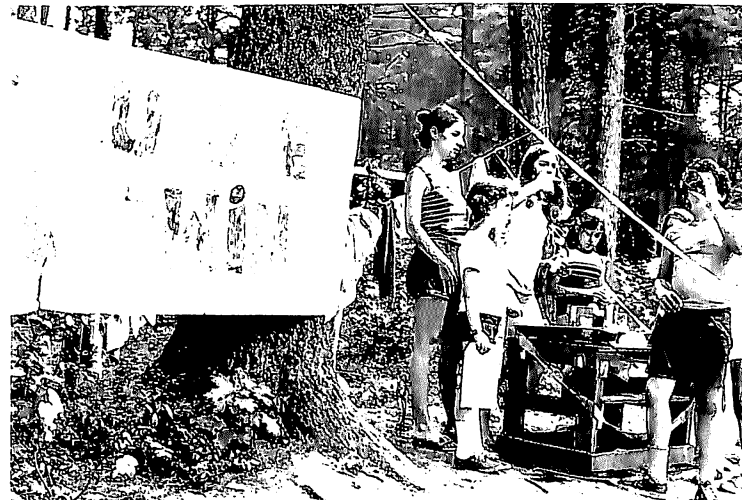

## Program Director's Message

Being a goal-oriented person working in a goal-oriented Agency, I'd like to share with you some realistic goals for this New Year.

First, and most important, is the reestablishment of the Jewish Community Center as Portland's program proponent. The Center is just that — THE CENTER of program activities and Jewish identification within our community. We offer extensive and varied activities for Pre-Schoolers through Senior Citizens in a comfortable, informal setting for all Jews no matter what their religious convictions and affiliations may be.

The Center not only welcomes all its Jewish brethren, but also our non-Jewish community. Membership in the Center is still one of the best bargains in town.

A second objective is to be cognizant of our membership's interests and needs. One way to achieve this understanding is to establish a system of committees whose members are sensitive and dedicated to the Center and community and who approach Center goals enthusiastically. Enthusiasm is contagious and a strong committee can infect a great many people with this wonderful "germ" we carry.

A third objective is to recruit and train a unique corps of volunteers, one which is willing to devote energetically its time and abilities to help insure a conscientious program.

These volunteers, whether they be Teens, Adults, or Older Adults, must unselfishly offer their services on a semi-regular or ongoing basis. A once-in-awhile volunteer just cannot provide the continuity of relationship which is so important in working with people.

A fourth goal is to promote family participation. Many 1973-1974 Center programs are geared specifically for family enjoyment and involvement. One step for each family to take in a forward direction would be that of a family budget, a budget of money and time.

It is true that many of the Center's program services have an attached registration fee, but this fee is most always at a lower than cost level. Recreation is rarely cheap, but at the Center not only is it low cost, it is professionally planned and implemented. Ongoing children's programs are provided at about one-third the cost of a babysitter and look what you get!

Time is equally important in your budget. In Portland, most adults and teens have memberships in several organizations at the same time. This can not only be costly in dollars and cents, but also in emotional stress. You must choose carefully where and how you will spend your valuable time. At the Center, your options are innumerable, but you are the one who must learn how to exercise these options, and it is difficult to enjoy yourself when your reason for activity attendance is that it is expected rather than that it is something you want.

My final thought is that this must be a year of honesty. Where is the Center going? If a new building is a possibility, let's make a decision. If the Center and Center Day Camp are going to continue to grow, who is willing to work for them. If you are not happy about the role the Center is playing in the community, let's hear from you. If you are uncertain as to the role the Center is playing, ask about it. If you are pleased with the Center, help others to share in your pleasure.


Goals are important to me and I understand their relevance in my life. How about you?

It is typical of many programs that the activities are not varied, and that stress is placed on catering to boys of junior high and high school age and the major activity is basketball. This is a valid criticism of many Y.M.C.A. and Center programs, and has been true of our own Center program to a degree. Our program has been a bit heavy on the side of **basketball for boys**. We have tried to offer a more varied program that would include a fair share of the total allotted gym time. It is never possible to give everyone as much as he would want, but it is possible to offer a fair distribution of gym time and instruction.

The gym schedule presently offers two periods weekly for elementary, junior high, high school and adult men. The activity is mostly basketball, but does include other sports during the Spring. Girls have one period per week for elementary, junior high and high school. The Sunday morning program is devoted to men's volleyball and an additional evening men's volleyball period was included in mid-winter.

Actually, the gym is in constant use and the classes have sustained themselves well, invariably larger at the end of the season.

There is much justification for the stress of boys' basketball as the bulk of the schedule. There is enthusiasm for the basketball, it is easier to get such a program established and the gym filled with eager youngsters. It is much more of a problem to entice adults and girls to avail themselves of the opportunities offered. It is most frustrating to administrators and instructors to find their pleas and entreaties to girls and adults to participate falling on deaf ears and the gym time going unused. This same gym time would have been gobbled up by boys' basketball. It is not too surprising then that administrators often take the easier and more expedient way and fill the gym with eager young basketball boys.

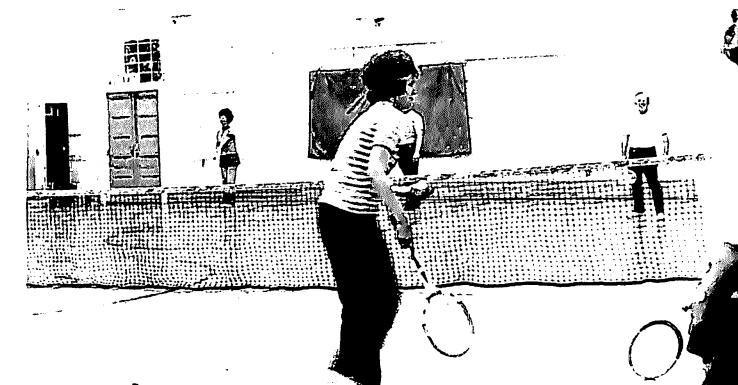

However, we are still sticking to our original objective for the Center, i.e., the goal of a varied and well-rounded program of physical activities, serving not only the young boys, but all ages, both sexes, and the varied interests of members as well. This is easier said than done, but we have made strides in this direction and intend to continue.

We have long thought a good gymnastic program would be possible at the Center. It would be hard work getting it established. It would be expensive to set up, but could be an outstanding success. The success of our gymnastic program at the Center Day Camp bears this out. The costs of apparatus is great, but vital to the program.

The success of the adult tennis program last winter suggests that adult classes in this and many other phases of physical activity would meet with an equally enthusiastic response. Fitness, badminton, archery, trampoline, etc., could be combined into one large Physical Education Class or taught as separate activities with a period devoted to each weekly.

The obstacles are numerous. In the first place, the gym is already quite full with what we now offer. Adding more will mean either cutting the present class time of existing classes or using other areas for some of the activities. For example, basketball and archery could be conducted simultaneously in two different areas with an instructor for each. The same could be true of volleyball and gymnastics in two areas. Again, you have the cost factor in two instructors being required where we have had only one in total.

The prime factor that will determine success of any adult program is that of an effective promotion and recruiting scheme. It is rare that I have had a class that started with a huge turnout then dwindled in size to a handful. I feel it is the instructor's responsibility to make classes interesting enough to assure solid and enthusiastic attendance. The difficulty lies in enticing the adults away from home and fireside to try a new endeavor for the first time. Once they arrive, the burden is on the determined and resourceful instructor to make the period fun and challenging enough to sustain their interest.

Our mission for the next season, then, is or can be to (1) continue the programs already prospering and (2) to expand the program in the direction of much more adult activity and new and varied programs, particularly for girls.

If the expense can be borne, I can visualize a great response to gymnastics for girls. Boys, too, will answer the call, but I feel that girls much more so. There is currently a nation-wide boom in girls' gymnastics.

The possibility for a wide choice of adult activities exists. Archery, fitness, badminton, tennis, trampoline, to name just some. If last year's tennis class could develop so quickly and easily the same could be true of other activities.

Speaking of Center Day Camp — the athletic facilities have been steadily improved to the point where now a solid program of athletics of a varied nature is possible. The most pressing need now is for tennis facilities. Here again, the expense item, but it certainly is a crucial need. If the trampoline and the success of the program involving it, so hesitantly added this year, is any criteria, the tennis courts would surely, over the years, justify the initial expense. Aside from the tennis need, there is little in the athletic line not available at Center Day Camp.
