

Complacency, many times, is the result of a membership that is fearful of speaking their minds.





This past year the Program Committee of the Jewish Community Center took a giant step forward in a positive direction.

During the summer of 1978, with the cooperation of the Membership Committee, an open house was held at the Day Camp for members and nonmembers of the Center. There was a large turnout and everyone had a good time.

Our regular schedule of activities mainly takes place on Sundays at the Riverton School facilities. We offer swimming, basketball, tennis, open volleyball and competition volleyball, soccer, arts and crafts, drama workshop, lectures and a variety of classes and instructional periods.

In response to the survey that was sent out at the end of last summer, the committee offered programs that were in keeping with the consensus of this group.

Last October, in conjunction with an open house at the Riverton facilities, the Program Committee and the Athletic Committee held its annual Maccabiah games. Also in October, we offered disco lessons for teenagers and the Center's Couples Bowling league started its first season.



My family and I wish everyone a very happy and healthy New Year.
















The Year Ahead at Center Day Camp

committee's desires.


