Mr. Lacritz has participated in many U. J. campaigns and recently chaired the Israel Bond Drive which was so successful in our community.

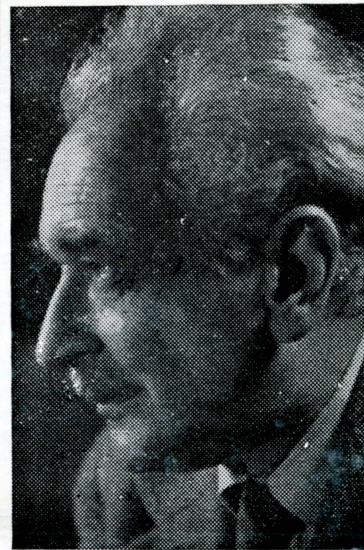
The United Jewish Campaign supports the United Jewish Appeal, our Council, Center and Hebrew School and 32 other local and national agencies.

Center Workers and  
Jewish Educators

NEW YORK—A blueprint to guide Jewish educators and Jewish Community Center workers in carrying out their common objectives of Jewish education for all age groups was published in the form of a 20-page brochure containing the texts of a series of nine statements outlining recommendations for the establishment of day to day working relationships between the fields of Jewish education and Jewish Community Center work.

The brochure was published by the Joint Committee of the American Association for Jewish Education and the National Jewish Welfare Board. This committee, headed by Judge Samuel Mellitz, Bridgeport, Conn., is an outgrowth of a two-day conference convened in November 1945 by JWB and the AAJE, in cooperation with the National Council for Jewish Education and the National Association of Jewish Center Workers. This conference formulated the first of the series of recommendations, dealing with "Common Objectives and areas of Cooperation in the Fields of Jewish Education and Jewish Community Center Work."

(Editor's Note—With this issue of the Community News we begin a series of articles describing the work of the many agencies and organizations who derive support from our United Jewish Campaign.)

The National Jewish Welfare Board serves the American Jewish community at home and in the U. S. Armed Forces, as the national association of Jewish Community Centers and YM-YWHAs, and as the government-authorized agency for religious, morale and welfare activities for Jewish men and women in our country's uniform.

JWB's Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy recruits, endorses and serves Jewish chaplains in all branches of the U. S. Armed Forces. The Department of Defense has asked that 115 Jewish chaplains minister to Jewish men in service, and JWB must continue to arrange religious services and holiday observances and provide religious materials, inspirational literature and kosher foods to Jewish men and women on duty in the Armed Forces of the U. S. in this country and in 49 countries overseas. In addition to the full-time Jewish chaplains, a corps of 249 part-time Jewish chaplains, similarly recruited, endorsed and served by JWB covers some 600 military installations and VA hospitals in the U. S. where no Jewish chaplains are on full-time duty.

JWB mobilizes the resources of some 300 Jewish communities in providing home hospitality, recreation activities and cultural programs for Jewish servicemen. GIs stationed overseas enjoy JWB hospitality and leisure-time programs in Germany, Japan, Alaska, Hawaii, Panama, England and France.

JWB serves 349 affiliated Jewish Community Centers and YMHAs, with an aggregate membership of over half-million men and women, boys and girls. For these, the Centers provide intensive programs and modern facilities which fill leisure hours with constructive activity, and at the side of the Centers is JWB.

To aid its affiliated Centers to meet the demands of the Community, JWB gives specialized service and guidance in every phase of Center operation and administration, including programming for all age groups—preschoolers, school-age children, teen-agers, young adults, adults and older folks—staffing, planning of new and remodeled buildings, equipment planning and purchasing, leadership training, guidance in health and physical education and camping programs, public relations counsel, aid in surveys and studies and guidance in membership and capital funds campaigns.

JWB's service is rendered through community visits, conferences, institutes, publications and written personal consultations from its national office, and its assistance is given on-the-spot through a field staff based in eight regional sections through the United States. From the time when a community group is formed to establish a Center program, to the point at which the Center is operating in its own building and thereafter, JWB offers a full range of services.

JWB also advances the cultural life of the Jewish community through its sponsorship of the Jewish Center Lecture Bureau, Jewish Book Council of America, National Jewish Music Council, and the National Jewish Youth Conference.

## U.J.A. To Launch Nationwide Campaign For Nearly \$100 Million on February 25

Jack Benny, one of the most outstanding personalities in the entertainment world, will take a prominent part in launching the 1955 nationwide campaign of the United Jewish Appeal at the UJA's National Inaugural Conference to be held at the Saxony Hotel in Miami Beach on February 25, 26 and 27, it was announced this past week by William Rosenwald, UJA General Chairman.

Mr. Benny, who has long been a staunch supporter of the UJA,

will fly in from Hollywood for the Miami meeting, Mr. Rosenwald announced. Distinguished figures in Israel and American life will address the gathering, he added.

More than 750 community leaders from all sections of the country, Mr. Rosenwald reported, will come together at the National Inaugural Conference to set in motion the UJA's 17th successive campaign for aid to dependent Jews in some 22 overseas countries and the United States. This year's goal is for \$99,521,275 to meet the requirements of UJA's constituent agencies, United Israel Appeal, Joint Distribution Committee and New York Association for New Americans.
