Bangor will be well represented at the New England Section of the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB) Golden Jubilee Convention on November 5 and 6 at the Hotel Somerset, Boston, Mass., Dr. Joseph G. Ornstein and Albert H. Friedman, members of the JWB Board of Directors, announced today.

Abbee W. Talamo, Worcester attorney and civic leader, has been named convention chairman. A former president of JWB's New England Section, Mr. Talamo has long been active in both the YMHA and Armed Forces morale phases of the organization's work. Maurice Kurn, Springfield business executive and Jewish leader, has been named chairman of the program and workshop committee for the convention.

Highlights of the history of the American Jewish community during the past 50 years will be presented at the convention, and prominent leaders who have been active for many years in community and youth service will be honored in an impressive ceremony. A pictorial exhibit will be on display.

JWB is both the National Association of YMHAs and Jewish Community Centers and the U. S. Government-accredited agency for serving the religious, welfare and morale needs of the Jewish personnel in the U. S. Armed Forces. It is one of six member agencies of USO.

Founded a half-century ago as the Associated YMHAs or New England, the JWB Section has developed to the point where it now includes more than 40 YMHAs and JCCs with 75,000 members and two camps. Originally set up to serve young men only, YMHAs and JCCs now cater to both sexes and all ages in the fields of informal education, recreation, culture, and health and physical education.

In New England, JWB also conducts morale programs for the military at 22 posts in Massachusetts, Connecticut, Maine, Rhode Island and New Hampshire. Altogether, 57 New England communities are active in JWB work or receive JWB services.

Mr. Leventhal is serving his third term as president of the New England Section.

Leonard Katowitz is administrative field secretary for the Section, and Edward Davidson is USO-JWB area director.

Center Youth To Participate in Leadership Training Institute
