Dear Member:

We are installing new plush seats which will greatly embellish our Synagogue for the High Holidays. We wish to give every member an equal opportunity to obtain these seats in the fairest and best way possible. Your Board of Directors has passed the following plan for the sale of these 234 plush seats.

- (1) The price of each seat is \$100.00. This entitles a person to the privilege of sitting in the upholstered section during his lifetime. Each seat may be purchased on credit, if necessary, with a \$25.00 deposit and nine months to pay the balance. If the balance is not paid in nine months, the money paid toward the purchase shall be forfeited and the seat shall be put up for sale again.
- (2) Seats may be sold only to Synagogue members in good standing.
- (3) The seats will be identified by rows and numbers. No specific seat will be sold to any member-only the privilege of sitting in the upholstered section. You will be notified as to the specific day and time when you will be able to reserve your seats for the coming High Holidays. Seats will be given out on a first come, first serve basis.
- (4) No name plates or memorial plates will be placed on these seats at the present time. This may be changed in the future by action of your Board of Directors.
- (5) The purchase of a seat does not exclude the possibility of a future nominal seat tax, if necessary, and if passed by your Board of Directors.
- (6) If there are any seats available in this section after the sale, they may be purchased for guests or yourself for the sum of \$25.00 a seat for the 1963 Holidays only. There will also be the usual folding metal chairs available behind the plush seats at no charge to Synagogue members in good standing.
- (7) All proceeds from the sale of these plush seats will be applied to the Building Fund.
