Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

This Shabbat, as I am sure you are aware, is Rosh Hashanah. Accordingly, our Torah reading for Shabbat falls outside of the regular cycle of Torah readings. Rather than continuing with Deuteronomy, we'll read the Akeidah, the Binding of Isaac (Genesis 22). It is a challenging and troubling story, one which our tradition interprets as a test of Abraham's faith in God. God commands Abraham to take his son Isaac to the top of Mount Moriah and offer him as a sacrifice. At the 11th hour, an angel calls out to Abraham,



who is clutching the knife, and tells him to stop, that he has proven his faith in God. In place of Isaac, Abraham pulls a ram from the thicket nearby and offers the ram as a sacrifice instead.

Our tradition says that there were ten things that were created at the twilight of Shabbat at the end of Creation. Among them is the ram that was offered in Isaac's place. Ultimately, the first people were expelled from the Garden of Eden, which serves as the model for the perfection of the world. But these ten items serve as the tools through which we will return to the Garden of Eden. They are the tools that help us to perfect the world. Rabbi Nachman of Breslov taught, "If you believe that destruction is possible, then you must also believe it is possible to repair." With all the brokenness in our world today, we must have the faith and conviction that we can repair our broken world.


Social Action

Maine's online system for applying for an absentee ballot for the November election is now available. Any Maine registered voter can choose to vote absentee, either by mail or in person. But to receive a ballot by mail, you must fill out the online request form. Once you have voted, you may choose to mail in your ballot, return it to your city clerk or town hall prior to or on election day, or take it to your polling place on election day.
