### **Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks**

At the end of this week's Torah portion, Chayei Sarah, following the death of Sarah, both Isaac and Abraham marry. Isaac marries Rebekah, the woman identified for him as his bride by Abraham's servant, Eliezer. Isaac brings Rebekah into his mother, Sarah's, tent. The text tells us that the two marry, that Isaac loves Rebekah, and that Isaac finally finds comfort after his mother's death. Just after this moment, the text tells us that Abraham also marries. He marries a woman named Keturah and she bears him six sons, at his ripe old age of 140.



The commentators debate the identity of this new wife for Abraham. Many take the simple, straightforward approach that she is a new woman in his life, but some indicated that Keturah is none other than Hagar, Sarah's maidservant whom she had Abraham exile into the wilderness. In this interpretation, the Sages have Isaac head out to find Hagar, after Sarah's death, to bring her back to Abraham. At long last, Abraham reconciles with Hagar after having banished her and her son, Ishmael, into the wilderness. The two reunite and have a family of their own. The Torah portion closes with Abraham's death, when full reconciliation finally occurs: Ishmael and Isaac reunite to bury their father. In these closing verses of our Torah portion, we see that even what seems improbable is still possible. Who would have thought that Hagar would return to Abraham after he cast her and her son into the wilderness? Who would have though that Isaac and Ishmael would reunite? The seemingly impossible happens, giving us hope that the conflicts in our relationships that seem unresolvable may yet have their time and that reconciliation may still occur.



## **Anti-Racism Discussion Group**

Please join us for a weekly discussion group of *Me and White Supremacy: Combat Racism, Change the World, and Become a Good Ancestor,* by Layla F. Saad. Saad takes readers through a step-by-step process of exploring white supremacy and how it has affected each one of us. She states, "White supremacy is a system you have been born into. Whether or not you have known it, it is a system that has granted you unearned privileges, protection, and power." She gives us tools for going deep into understanding of our own racism. She helps us find ways to become better allies to Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, and to find pathways to Tikkun Olam.



We will meet weekly for four weeks, preparing each week by reading identified chapters and writing personal responses to the journaling questions posed in the book. During our meetings, we will have a chance to discuss the questions, the process, and the issues that arise. At the end of the four weeks, we will decide if the group wishes to continue to meet and, if so, in what format.
