Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

The story of Jacob's dream appears in this week's Torah portion, *Vayeitzei*, with his vision of a ladder to heaven, with angels ascending and descending on it. Just before Jacob lays himself down for the night, the text tells us that he gathered stones on which to rest his head. Later, though, the text says that he takes the stone, mentioned in the singular, and sets it up as a monument. What happened to the multiple stones? Rashi, the 11th century commentator and scholar, notes that at first there *were* multiple



stones, but there's a reason why later only one is recorded. Rashi offers that God must have molded the multiple stones into one, perhaps because they'd been fighting over which one would have the honor of cradling Jacob's head. God unites them to bring an end to the jealousy and argument. This week of Thanksgiving, when we gather with friends and family and reflect on the bounty in our lives and express our gratitude for it, let us remember that we must see ourselves as one, all as parts of a larger whole.
