Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

When Jacob wrestles with the angel in the famous scene depicted in this week's Torah portion, *Vayishlach*, he demands a blessing before the angel departs in the morning. We know that the blessing is a change in Jacob's name—he will now be called Israel—but the Sages wonder why Jacob asks for a blessing at all. One theory is that the angel with whom Jacob is wrestling is Esau's guardian angel, the same Esau from whom he stole the blessing when they were younger. In this moment before he reunites with his brother, Jacob



realizes that in spite of their past, he needs not only his father's blessing, but his brother's, too. When he could have been too afraid to meet Esau, after all they had been through, Jacob musters the courage not only to meet his brother, but also to ask for his blessing and, we hope, to offer his own as well. We can be inspired by Jacob's courage to seek and offer the blessings that we need in our lives.
