Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

In this week's Torah portion, *Vayeishev*, Jacob's favoritism of Joseph reaches a breaking point when Joseph's brothers decide they must be done with him. They throw him in a pit, intent upon getting rid of him. The text tells us that the pit into which they cast Joseph was empty and then it mentions that the pit had no water in it.



Rashi, the 11th century commentator, asks why the text would have

to tell us that the pit didn't have water in it after it has already established that the pit was empty. Rashi proposes that the pit was void of water, but filled with snakes and scorpions. His grandson, Rashbam, finds this to be a little far-fetched and suggests that it is not a bad thing that there isn't any water. True, if there had been water in the pit, the snakes and scorpions wouldn't have been there. However, if the pit had been full of water, Joseph would have surely drowned immediately. Others consider the notion that if there had been at least some water, but not a lot, it would have helped Joseph's chance of survival, providing him with some sustenance after his brothers abandoned him.

When we consider the empty pit, without water, into which Joseph was cast, we are reminded that the outcome of a situation can often be dependent upon how we choose to see it. In a few weeks, when Joseph's brother express remorse for having sold him into slavery, he reminds them that had they not, he would never have been able to save them and Egypt from the famine. He assures them it was all a part of God's plan. Joseph recognizes the bigger picture. As Rabbi Harold Kushner writes, "Much of the time we cannot control what happens to us. But we can control how we respond to what happens to us. If we cannot choose to be lucky, to be talented, to be loved, we can choose to be grateful, to be content with who we are and what we have, and to act accordingly."
