Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

At the end of this week's Torah portion, Tzav, which outlines many of the sacrificial offerings of the days of the Mishkan and the Temple, we are told that Aaron and his sons did all of the things which the Eternal had commanded them. Rashi, the 11th century renowned commentator, teaches that this verse tells us that Aaron and his sons, in their role as the priests of the Israelites' worship, did exactly as they were told, neither veering to the right or the left from what was expected of them. The Chatam Sofer, a Chasidic



commentator, asks if we would expect any less of the High Priest and his sons. Why would Torah or Rashi have needed to tell us that they did exactly as they were told? He answers his own question, teaching that often when expectations are placed upon us, we fulfill them, but we do so begrudgingly. In this moment, Aaron and his sons serve as an example to us that when we are asked to complete a task, whether that request comes from God, from our family, from our friends, or from anyone else, we should perform the task with the fullness of our hearts, giving it as much devotion and attentiveness as we would expect from others if we were making the request of them. Our sincerity in responding to the needs of others is one of the paths to peace.

New! Schmooze before the seder!





National Council of Jewish Women, Southern Maine Section Scholarship Program

Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors and undergraduate college students primarily on the basis of financial need with consideration for academic achievement and Jewish as well as

In addition to need-based awards the Selma Gleit Memorial Scholarship for Women in STEM is presented to a Jewish female high school senior or college student who has demonstrated excellence and commitment in science, technology, engineering and/or math, without consideration of need.
