Our Plant Sale is the primary fundraiser which supports our goals.

- Enhance, through the gardens, the spiritual experience of members and quests.
- Design, improve, and maintain the synagogue gardens.
- Nurture and create new ideas, as necessary, for the Bet Ha'am gardens.
- Plant and harvest produce in raised beds to donate to food relief programs.
- Support the congregational educational programs for adults and students as they relate to tending the earth.

In order to have a nice plant inventory we need your help!

Sun, shade, foliage, and flowering plants are needed. Perennials, annuals, and seedlings too!

Gardens are blooming early this spring which allows a home gardener to see those plants that can be divided and donated to our sale. Once you dig your plant, if at all possible, please bare-root the plant over newspaper. Toss that soil and paper into the trash, not compost, and re-pot with commercial potting soil. This helps to lessen the spread of invasive bugs and insects.

Not a home gardener or do not have a plant to dig up this year? Perhaps you purchase annuals, seedlings, or a plant for your yard at a local garden center. Please consider buying an extra flat or pot to donate in support of our goals.

Starting May 9th, you can drop off your donation in a pot or plastic bag beside the raised beds at Bet Ha'am. Please label the plant with its name and care such as sun or shade plant.
