Dear Congregants and Friends,

Shanah Tovah! As we've been enjoying the end of our Maine summer, Bet Ha'am's Board, staff and volunteers have been working together to plan for High Holy Day services. Before we gather, I want to update you on some important changes that will affect our observance this year.

At this time, we are planning a hybrid service that will provide both in-person and online worship opportunities. Whether you plan to join us in the sanctuary or from the comfort of your own home, we are working to provide a worshipful experience for all. Our goal is to gather as a community to collectively experience the High Holy Days and to do so as safely as possible. After careful deliberation, our Board of Trustees put attendance protocols into place to ensure the safety of our service leaders, our staff, and the entire community. These protocols were developed under the guidance of our Reopening Task Force as it continues to monitor current COVID-19 trends and CDC recommendations. They are as follows:

- Masks must be worn at all times while indoors and must properly cover the nose and mouth. Masks are not required outdoors, unless there will be singing.
- All individuals who wish to attend worship services in person must be fully vaccinated and be willing to attest to vaccination status.
- Advance registration for in-person services is required.
- Eating is not allowed in the building.
- Children's services will be held online only.

Although leadership choices continue to be influenced by the ongoing pandemic, we are confident that a conservative approach will ensure the safety of our congregation and allow us to continue to worship together in person. We thank you for trusting us with such important decisions.

In the meantime, a member of the Board of Trustees will be reaching out during the High Holy Day season to connect with you and wish you a Happy New Year. Please take the time to talk with them or to <a href="mailto:emailt
