Words of Torah

When the rabbis consider this week's Torah portion, B'reishit, in the Mishnah (Sanhedrin 4:5) and its narrative about the creation of the first human being, they ask why God chose to begin humanity with a single person. Among a number of possible answers, there are two that stand out to me. The first is that with a single human being as our common ancestor, none of us can say that our lineage is any better than anyone else's. The second is that when God created the mold for the first human being, part of the miracle of



that mold is that unlike coins minted from a mold, which all turn out the same, the mold that God used to create the first human being, which is used to form all of us, creates each of us differently. Even though we don't take the story of Creation literally, we see the truth in it that even as we are each different and have something unique to offer the world, we are all connected to one another.

Staff Shabbatical

In recognition of the excellent service our staff has provided through the last year and the value and impact of rest and rejuvenation in our tradition, the Bet Ha'am Board of Trustees approved a one-week paid "Shabbatical" for staff to align with Rabbi Saks' scheduled vacation.
