Hello,

I think we have two topics to discuss at a program committee meeting before the June board meeting:

- 1. Can we pull off a successful webinar to launch the synagogue project? What will it take? (Will resend the email thread following this email)
- 2. Opportunity for a joint webinar series with JCA and ADL (see below)

Following my conversations with both of you about developing a webinar series for the museum, I asked David if he might be interested in launching the series with a webinar, figuring the communities might be interested in hearing from him. He mentioned that he was having similar conversations about a webinar series with Molly Curran Rowles at the JCA. They spoke this morning, and she is interested in pursuing this, and perhaps inviting the synagogues to cosponsor as well, making this a community-wide event.

Here are the topics he proposed:

Jews, Christians, and Israel
Old, new hate anti-semitism today
Anti-semitism at a time of Covid 19
Philo-semitism and Judaisizing in Contemporary Christianity
A History of Anti-Semitism

A significant advantage of doing this jointly with the JCA is that they hav staff capacity to implement webinars and presumably the track record to attract audiences.

This opportunity raises some questions for MJM:

- \* are these topics consistent with our mission?
- \* should/could we tweak the topics to add Maine dimensions?
- \* if one of our goals for doing a webinar series is to raise the visibility of MJM, will a joint program of this nature give us enough visibility?
- \* alternatively, is partnering with other Jewish institutions the best way to attract audiences to a webinar series? (Do we have the capacity to deliver a webinar series? Could we get sufficient audiences for webinars by going it alone?)
- \* which of these topics could be combined with the work Abe and Harris have been doing? E.g. David could present on the national history of anti-semitism, Abe and/or Harris could offer the Maine perspective

If you agree that these topics are worthy of discussion by the program committee, I will schedule it with the full committee for some time next week.
