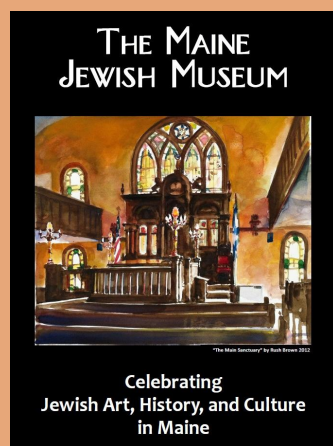

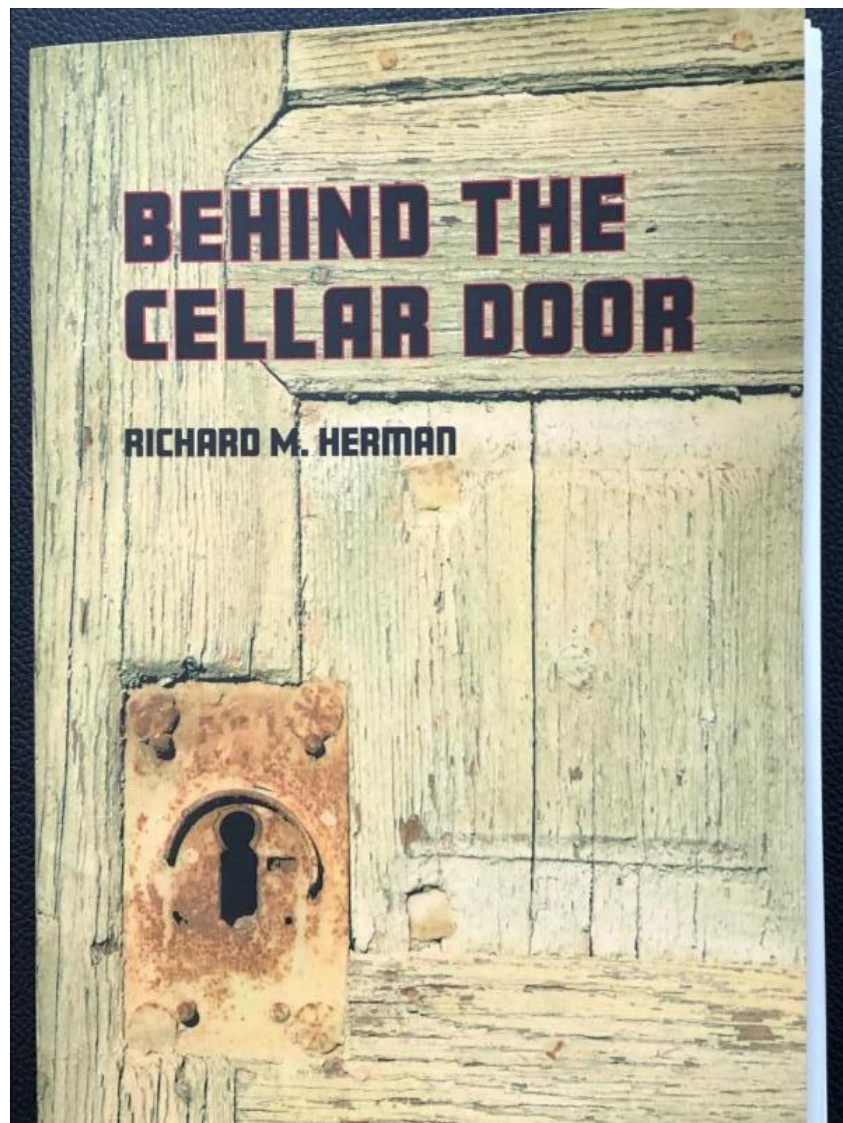

As the Nazis take control of Germany, Hilde's family becomes targeted by the secret police.

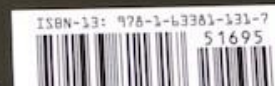
They shut down her father's newspaper and detain him on trumped up charges.
