While the response of the American Government towards shipping Israel much needed supplies has been excellent, it is necessary that we continue our communications both to the Executive and Legislative branches of government. Here are two samples of messages that were sent to the President by the Presidents Conference and the Synagogue Council of America. Use these as patterns.

THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY SUPPORTS THE POSITION OF OUR GOVERNMENT IN IMPLEMENTING THE ESTABLISHED POLICY OF MAINTAINING THE BALANCE OF ARMS IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND IN SUPPLYING ISRAEL WITH MATERIEL REQUIRED TO REPEL ARAB AGGRESSION AND TO MEET THE CHALLENGE OF THE CONTINUING MASSIVE SOVIET RESUPPLY AIRLIFT.

WE JOIN IN COMMENDING OUR GOVERNMENT'S DECISION TO SUPPLY ISRAEL THE ARMS WITH WHICH TO WITHSTAND THE ONSLAUGHT OF ARAB ARMIES. THE INCITEMENT TO EVEN LARGER VIOLENCE AND BLOODSHED REPRESENTED BY THE MASSIVE CONTINUING SOVIET AIRLIFT TO SYRIA AND EGYPT AND BY SOVIET PRESSURES ON OTHER ARAB GOVERNMENTS TO JOIN THE CONFLICT OUTRAGES THE MORAL AND RELIGIOUS SENSIBILITIES OF ALL DECENT MEN, IRRESPECTIVE OF FAITH. WE SUPPORT OUR GOVERNMENT TO STAND UNWAVERINGLY WITH THE BRAVE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE STATE OF ISRAEL IN THEIR DESPERATE TRIAL AND TO SUPPLY THEM UNSTINTINGLY WITH THE MEANS NEEDED IN THEIR BATTLE FOR SURVIVAL.
