

Constance Miller Grossman died on Wednesday evening, Feb. 1, 2017, at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Adele and Barry Faber, in Rockland. She was 102 years old.

Born Dec. 5, 1914, Constance was the oldest member of Adas Yoshuron Synagogue. The daughter of Benjamin and Mollie Miller, Constance lived her entire life in Rockland. Her husband, A. Alan Grossman, was president of Adas Yoshuron from 1953-1975. Her father was president of the synagogue at its inception, in 1913.

Constance is survived by her daughter Adele Faber and her husband Barry Faber, and her daughter Martha Sholes and her husband Richard Sholes. She is also survived by many grandchildren and great-grandchildren, including her granddaughter Ida Faber, who often accompanied Constance to Adas Yoshuron on Rosh Hashanah.

A funeral will be held on Friday, Feb. 3, at Adas Yoshuron Synagogue, followed by burial at the Owls Head Cemetery. Details of exact timing and of the *shiva* will be made available on Thursday.
