# WELCOME CANTORIAL INTERN JEFFREY WARSCHAUER



Please join us in welcoming Cantorial Intern Jeffrey Warschauer of the Jewish Theological Seminary, who will be joining us for Shabbat services and special programming each month. Come meet Jeff and enjoy a new approach to services over the weekends of Oct. 31 - Nov. 2, Nov. 14-16, and Nov. 21-23. Stay tuned for further details and more dates!

We asked Jeff some questions to help introduce him to our congregation:

# What drew you to becoming a cantor?

JW: I decided to become a cantor for a few reasons:

First of all, I love working with individuals and groups, of all ages and backgrounds, to help them grow musically and spiritually. This might mean, for example, helping someone learn to daven or to improve their synagogue skills, or to create an opportunity for them to sing or play an instrument in a synagogue choir or band.

Second, I've been involved in many short-term residencies over the years, which have been wonderful! But I really value the opportunity to work with a community over a long period of time, as opposed to "dropping in" for a weekend or a week. A lot of creative work can only happen over time.

Third, I'm fascinated by liturgy and by synagogue music. In a sense, Cantorial school as been a sort of "finishing school" for me as a well-rounded Jewish musician and singer.

Fourth, over time I've wanted a more stable, Jewishly-observant life, which is a difficult match with the freelance, touring musical lifestyle.

Fifth, being a cantor is a great job! I just love to daven (pray). And I love to help others daven, too.

### Tell us a bit about your Jewish and musical influences.

JW: I've been immersed in Jewish music since the early 80s, particularly Klezmer instrumental music, Hasidic music and Yiddish song. I've been performing and teaching internationally, especially in Eastern and Western Europe, and across North America, with the Klezmer Conservatory Band and others, most particularly in a duo with my wife and musical partner, Deborah Strauss.

At the same time, I've become more and more involved with synagogue life and Jewish studies in general. >> continued on page 7

It's been an exciting autumn at Kadima Beth El! We enjoyed learning about the High Holidays together, making Jonah-andthe-whale puppets in Morah Diana's class, working on saying that hardest word (hint: it's "sorry") in Morah Debbie's class, and exploring both the sukkah and the Torah scroll with Morah Heidi – while learning important prayers for the holidays with Morah Lisa. In the months to come, we're looking forward to spending more time with the whole KBE community, praying and eating together at our monthly Shabbat HaLaila services and communal meals, and partying together at Chanukah. # THE UNRECOGNIZED POWER OF WORDS

I occasionally find myself in the mood to take a break from the computer to read just a few sections of various books that I find in our TBE Library or from one that I "borrowed" off of Rabbi Braun's shelf in her office. As I read a chapter or two that had an interesting title, or even just a part of a paragraph, I find myself relating it to experiences in my personal surroundings at work, home or in public. I recently read parts of a book entitled *Words That Hurt*, *Words That Heal*, *How to Choose Words Wisely and Well* by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin and found a particular anecdote and review to be something that we all should pay more attention to. The story made me think about how, when speaking to or about other people or when in certain situations, we easily fall into a pattern of speaking that we pay little attention to because it has become as familiar to us as tying our shoes. I decided to share an excerpt from this story that I found interesting... I hope you find it equally inspiring.

The following sections are paraphrased from Words That Hurt, Words That Heal, How to Choose Words Wisely and Well by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin:

In a small Eastern European village, a man went through the community slandering the rabbi. One day, feeling suddenly remorseful, he begged the rabbi for forgiveness and offered to undergo any penance to make amends. The rabbi told him to take a father pillow from his home, cut it open and scatter the feathers to the wind, then return to see him. The man did as he was told, then came to the rabbi and asked, "Am I now forgiven?"

"Almost," came the response. "You just have to do one more thing. Go and gather all the feathers."

"But that's impossible," the man protested. "The wind has already scattered them!"

"Precisely," the rabbi answered. "And although you truly wish to correct the wrong that you have done, it is as impossible to repair the damage done by your words as it is to recover the feathers."

This famous tale is a testimony about the power of speech. Words said about us can define our place in the world. Once that "place," our reputation, is defined – especially when it is negative – it is very hard to reverse.

That words are powerful may seem obvious, but the fact is that most of us, most of the time, use them lightly. We choose our clothes more carefully than we choose our words, though what we say about and to others can define them indelibly. That is why ethical speech – speaking fairly of others, honestly about ourselves and carefully to everyone – is so important.

After digesting what Rabbi Telushkin was discussing, it seemed that expressing ourselves appropriately has as much to do with how what we are saying is perceived by others as it does about getting our intended message across. Have you even said something and then wondered "Why did I say that?" or "I wish I had said that in a different way." It also seems clear that not only should we be more cognizant of how we choose our words when discussing a person or event, but additionally how we respond to those who speak to, or about, us or others. We have often heard that we should listen to the underlying message and respond to that intention, not only to the words being spoken. Based on that ideal, your Temple Beth El staff meets weekly to not only discuss upcoming events and building needs, but also to discuss how best to help, speak with and attend to all of your inquiries, phone calls and emails in the most appropriate manner. Through this weekly discussion we hope to achieve a consistent manner of welcoming you in a courteous and understanding way.

Rabbi Isaacs is the Rabbi of Beth El Congregation in Waterville and the Jewish Chaplain at Colby College. The loose floor tiles in the social hall were repaired by Geoff Hindall, who also performed a preventative maintenance check throughout the building.

Terry Veysey and Gil Dichter began the process of winterizing the office windows.

Some of you may have noticed the scaffolding in the sanctuary this summer. This was a process that resulted in identifying and repairing areas that have been causing roof leaks for several years. Repairs were made around the duct work and HVAC systems. Interior damaged areas have also been fixed.

Our Executive Director, Jodi Veysey coordinated the repair of a kitchen refrigerator and freezer. She made certain that cracks in the parking lot were patched in time for the holidays.

The IT room, where our dedicated volunteer and house committee member Tom Berman spends so much time keeping things running smoothly, received a small heating and cooling unit. This helps to assure that the temperature is optimal for the systems to function efficiently.

The house committee worked with a tree specialist to trim the trees surrounding the building. It has helped to keep the area safe, beautify our space and lengthen the life of the trees.

The big storm in August resulted in a flood in the boiler room. Rabbi Braun, Jodi and Terry Veysey, and our custodian Bob Bradbury came in during the night to control the flooding and clean up the mess. In the morning they ensured the equipment was checked for damages.

Thanks to Tom Berman for his persistence and research resulting in new, brighter and more efficient lighting has been installed in the small chapel.

# TIKKUN OLAM COMMITTEE

The TBE community continues to be very generous! Since July, the TBE community has donated, and the Tikkun Olam Committee has delivered, approximately 15 bags of food, toiletries, and household items and 23 bags of food to the Preble Street Resource Center, the Jewish Family Services Food Pantry, and the ASPIRE program. Please keep those donations coming – they are making a difference in people's lives!

We launched a cold-weather clothing drive in September, and have already received many donations of winter coats, clothing, and accessories (hats, gloves, mittens, scarves, and socks). We will be continuing this drive through November, so please donate any items you can. Families with rapidly growing children: as you buy your children new gear for this winter, please bring in the clothing and gear that are too small!

The committee has created a list of over 30 local organizations and companies that accept donations of or will recycle various items from electronics to eyeglasses to blue jeans. The list is available on the TBE website or in hard copy in the front lobby.

Did you know that 15% of families in Maine don't know the source of their next meal? The committee has been engaged in conversations with NCJW (the National Council of Jewish Women), Congregation Bet Ha'am, and Jewish Family Services about a new NCJW-led initiative to address the rising problem of food insecurity in Maine. This effort was kicked off on October 19<sup>th</sup>, in an event held at TBE featuring Amy Regan Gallant, Preble Street Maine Hunger Initiative and Advocacy Coordinator, who discussed the issue of hunger in Maine, current programs, legislation, and advocacy. The Tikkun Olam committee co-sponsored the event with NCJW.

Both inside and outside of services, I want to help the community at TBE flourish spiritually, intellectually, musically and artistically.

I say "artistically," because I like to think of synagogue participation as a creative, artistic pursuit. We are all artists -- kids, adults, seniors, everyone -- and we all have unique and precious gifts to offer to our community. A big part of my job as a cantor is to help nurture those creative contributions, and to help our members grow in their approach to Judaism and to synagogue life.

JW: Fun fact 1: I have deep connections to Maine! I grew up and went to conservatory in the Boston area, and I spent a lot of time hiking and climbing all over Maine and New Hampshire. And saltwater taffy at the Goldenrod in York Beach was a major feature of my childhood.

Fun fact 2: Deborah and I are Yiddish speakers, and for many years we have been researching and collecting Yiddish and Hebrew songs and instrumental melodies in North America, Europe and Israel.
