Crafting Patterns and Pathways for Success

On a wintry night of snow showers and hail, more than 70 members of the Waterville community, about half of whom were Colby students, gathered for Community Conversations in the Chace Family Forum to discuss the role of family in contemporary America. We began our event with a dynamic conversation among three women of differing political backgrounds, all of whom had strong disagreement on issues of culture, economics, and family ideals. After they laid their cards on the table, the audience members began to engage in facilitated discussions. Our moderators included a single mom, a stay-at-home mom, a progressive community activist, and the president of the local Hadassah chapter. For one hour, a truly diverse, multigenerational crowd—representing every type of American family—whether or not it is truly in crisis and how to address it. It was a night our staff great pride that the center could serve as a platform for such thoughtful and robust scholarship, respectful debate, and meaningful exchange. Not only did the event bring people together as citizens, but also brought the Center closer to the heart of the Waterville community.
