It is our sincere wish that these packages arrived in time for the Chunukah Season, giving these deprived children a little happiness and hope for the future.

Mrs. Louis Black, Federal Projects Coordinator for the Public Schools of Portland, was the speaker at the study group which met at the home of Mrs. David Lewis on November 10, 1966.

Mrs. Black characterized federal aid to education as "the most exciting thing that has happended to education in my life time". She reminded Council that the group had for many years worked for this, and its efforts had in the past been defeated primarily by the problems of separation of church and state. Mrs. Black explained that the Elementary and Secondary Education Act handled this problem well and equitably; that under this Act, unlike previous Acts, the public schools institute the programs for the parochial schools; i.e., remedial teachers are assigned by the public schools for part of the time, to the parochial schools; two science teachers have been hired by the Portland School but paid by federal funds, and they also do some work in the parochial schools, a science supervisor supervises both public and parochial schools and gives "in service" training to all science teachers. Mrs. Black stated most of the programs were directed toward the disadvantaged child. However, she advised that one exciting development made possible through federal funds was the housing of all audiovisual materials and extra supplementary materials under one roof. With a staff of three professors, so that a teacher can contact them and say she is doing "social study class on Russia at the 5th grade level" and ask that they furnish her with all materials they have on it. The staff will put it together so that it can be picked up and used the next day. This is used by colleges and all school systems in and around Portland.

Mrs. Black explained Operation Safety as a summer activity program for education of about two hundred slow learners, under achievers, and those with attendance problems at school —— the potential school dropouts. These children were identified by guidance people. It was a flexible program so structured as to allow the student to take courses he liked. There were a lot of field trips related to what was being studied; swimming, physical education, plus trying to get afternoon jobs for them. Breakfast and lunch was furnished. The ration was fifteen students for every one teacher. Throughout the summer there were absolutely no behavior problems. The students learned for the first time that they could achieve and could succeed. The program was rated as "outstanding, well conceived, and well executed, and could well be a model for the rest of the country."

Mrs. Black also talked about the Pupil Rehabilitation Educational Program designed for boys and girls returning to Portland from Boys Training School and Stevens Training School for girls. This program will be an attempt to sufficiently rehabilitate these children, not only emotionally, but educationally, as to allow them to successfully integrate into the public school system. We thank Selma Black for a most stimulating and educational study group.

Our next study group will be held on February 9th, at 8:00 P.M. at the home of Mrs. Harold Berk, 135 Craigie Street. The discussion will be on "Mental Health", and our speaker will be Mr. Linwood Brown, Director of the Sweetser Home for Emotionally Distrubed Children.

#### PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Supporters of Stevens, the state wide organization of citizens organized to educate the public as to the needs of Stevens Training School for Girls located at Hallowell, Maine, and to assist in securing the necessary legislation to implement the building and programming at the institution, held a meeting at the Woodford's Congregational Church, December 15, 1966. Mr. Luther Allen, Cumberland County Chairman of the group, introduced Mrs. Harry Glassman, state chairman, Mrs. Alan Levenson, Treasurer, Mrs. Hazel Loveitt, State Publicity Chairman, and Dr. Pauline McCready, Superintendent or Steven's Training School.

The organization has created widespread interest throughout the state, resulting in Christmas gifts for the students at Stevens, and in increasing individual and organizational membership in the organization. This group resulted in a large part from Council's undertaking Steven's Training School as a continuing project of Council's public affairs project. Individual membership dues are \$1.00 a year and should be mailed to Mrs. Alan Levenson. Checks should be made out to "Supporter's of Steven." The funds are being used for mailing costs of literature outlining the legislative proposals for Stevens, and all members of Supporters of Stevens will be advised as to the progress of these proposed bills. It is Council's position that all women in the State should interest themselves in the conditions at Stevens Training School for Girls, and that joining Supporters of Stevens is the most effective and expeditious means by which to assist this institution.
