## FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

In the midst of the harried movement of a large city is a room set aside for quiet meditation. You can find this small room in the United Nation's Building on 41st > Street and 1st Avenue in New York City. It is bare. There is only a single large slab of stone and a ray of light from the ceiling which plays upon it. All else is darkness. The reasons for the choice of materials it contains must remain ambiguous. Perhaps the use of stone and light common to all people and lands is the furthest symbol we can use in our age to fulfill the prophetic ideal that all nations shall come to know and worship one God together.

In any case the thought represented here is a splendid one. That there must be a center of quiet in the midst of tumult. Here is a reminder that noise can deter us from encountering God, or His seeking

The most moving moment in a tour I took several years ago of a great multimillion dollar religious structure in the mid-West, electronically controlled to the hilt, was my experience with the quiet center of meditation within its extravagance. Everything was big, bright and new. In the small chapel of this empty magnificent institution there was the presence of a single worshipper in the middle of the day. He sat in quiet meditation, oblivious to all but his private thoughts.

I have thought many times since then of this marvelous use of a sanctuary. Our spirits need periodic quiet refreshment within the fury of sounds that we continuously experience.
