IT NEED NOT HAPPEN

There is no doubt that the articles which appear in the May issue of the National Jewish Monthly, published by the B'nai B'rith, are receiving considerable attention. The articles I refer to are on "What U. S. Jewry Will Be Like 50 Years From Now", written by Dr. Jacob R. Marcus and Dr. Oscar Handlin. Both scholars are of the opinion that the Jewish community in America is destined for survival, but they differ as to the form and composition into which the community will change. Dr. Handlin of Harvard specifies quite clearly: "The danger is not so much that the community will disappear, but that its culture will become a museum piece, preserved out of curiosity and ancestral piety, but devoid of meaning."

"This must not happen" said a congregant to me on reading the article. His reference, of course, was the statement that Jewish culture will become "a museum piece". My immediate reply was that it need not happen, not if we are serious and determined in making Jewish learning something real, something that is alive and meaningful. I recalled to my congregant the events that led to the establishment of the Jewish Theological Seminary more than fifty years ago. It was this very sense of awareness of what might happen to the American Jewish community that prompted the leaders then to prepare for Jewish leadership in the fields of the Jewish learning and religion. And today, in 1957, Jewish communities, throughout America, are stabilizing themselves with Synagogues, Temples and Educational institutions, guided and directed by scholars and leaders whom the Jewish Theological Seminary of America has taught and inspired.

"It will take vigilance in the future and more conscious effort to keep the spirits of men from being stifled . . ." is the concluding counsel of Dr. Handlin. It will take energetic devotion and whole-hearted cooperation on the part of every Temple member to make possible the continuation of the Higher Educational Program which the Jewish Theological Seminary has so gloriously projected.

In appointing the respective Temple Committees, Carl Zolov has asked Messrs. Lewis Bernstein and George I. Lewis to head the Seminary Committee on the Temple's behalf. The Chairmen are confident of your generous support.
